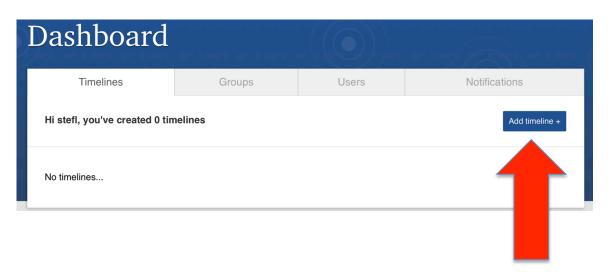
When you visit https://www.timetoast.com you will click on "Create Your Account" then you will be prompted to choose a plan. Please choose the "Public" option.

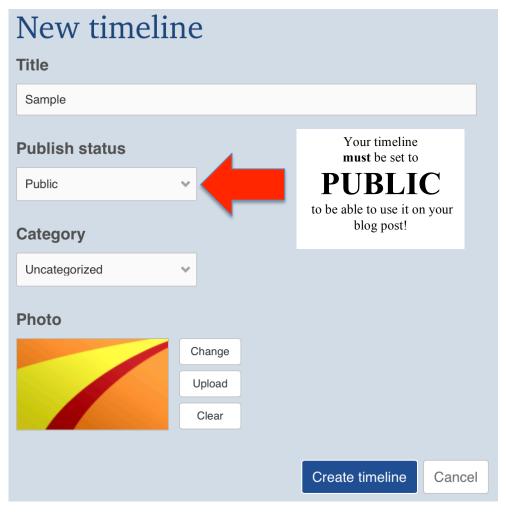
After you choose a plan, you will be prompted to put in your information, then hit 'create your account' you will receive an email.

You will be greeted with this page!

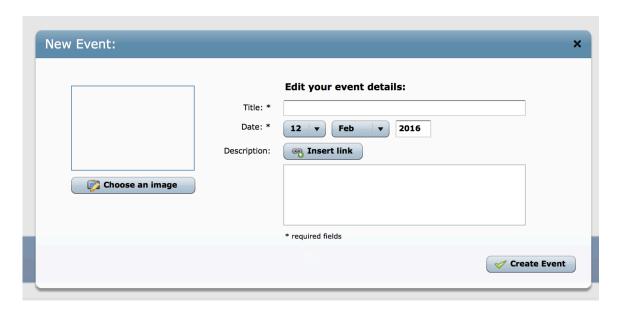
Things to think about:

- Category doesn't matter
- The photo is like a "profile picture" for your timeline

When you're done, hit "create timeline" to start adding events.

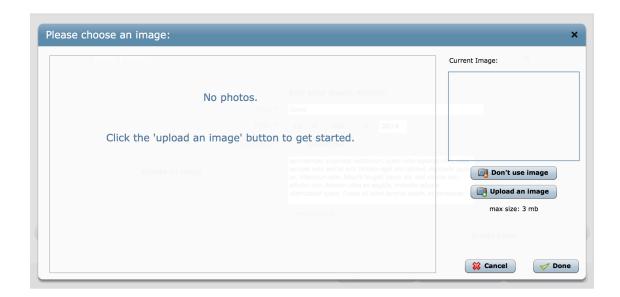


Simply click "Add Event" each time you want to add something to your timeline.



## Things to Remember:

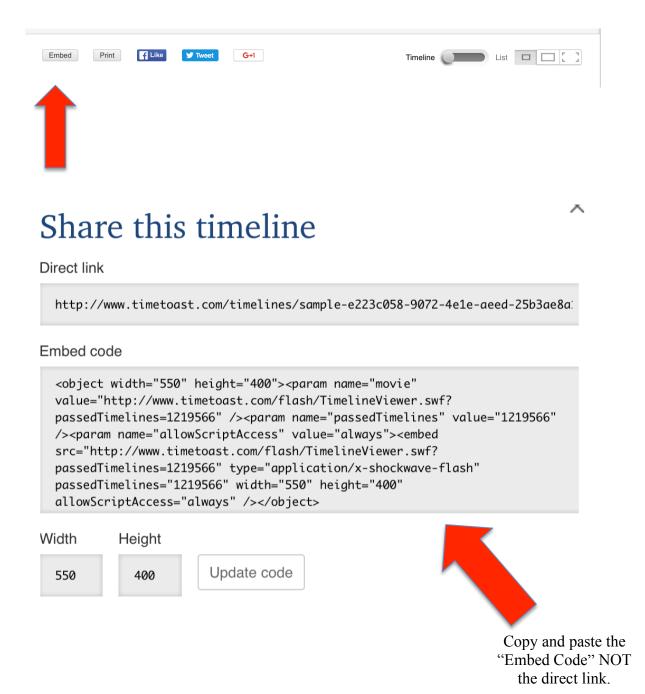
- Keep titles accurate and short
- If you do not know the exact date, you just know the year its easiest to take an educated guess on the month and keep the date the first
- You can insert links to other pages
- Utilize the descriptions!
  - It will help move your point without messing with your word count!



## You will need to upload pictures before using them (just like you do on Word Press)

Don't forget to utilize pictures, as they say, a picture is worth a thousand words!

Once you have uploaded your pictures, complete your event and hit "create event"



Similar to posting Google Maps, you will need to paste the code in Word Press.

Be sure to post this in the CODE function on Word Press not the "text" version you usually work in.
